## **CAMP TO CHAIR GRAPHIC ARTS EDUCATION AND RESEARCH FOUNDATION**

Randolph W. Camp, President of Monroe Graphics in Monroe, Georgia, has been elected chairman of the Board of Directors of the Graphic Arts Education and Research Foundation. After graduating from the University of Georgia, Camp joined his family's newspaper and printing business and helped it evolve into Walton Press, a commercial sheetfed and web print company. In 1997, the company was renamed Walton Graphic Media, which merged with an Atlanta mail and fulfillment operation in 2002, to become Walton Media Services. For the last year, Camp has served as a director for both Graphic Arts Show Company, Inc (GASC<sup>®</sup>) and the Graphic Arts Education and Research Foundation (GAERF<sup>®</sup>).

David R. Reny, Vice President and Managing Director, Standard Finishing Systems Company, was elected vice chairman.

The grant-making program has awarded over \$4.5 million in funding to support more than 125 projects at more than 44 institutions. PrintED<sup>®</sup> is a national accreditation program for graphic communications courses of study at the secondary and post-secondary levels, which currently numbers more than 150 accredited programs and more than 50 candidate programs. The MAKE YOUR MARK<sup>®</sup> in Graphic Communications program is a campaign to raise awareness of the graphic communications industry and its career opportunities.
